\$100 Pension Set In New Petition

Preliminary petition for an initiative measure providing for a maximum monthly annuity of \$100 to 11 residents of Oregon over the age of 65 years was filed in the state department today by Elbert Eastman of Portland.

Funds with which to administer the law would be raised by a 2 per cent transaction tax similar to that proposed in the initiative measure filed recently by the state Townsend organization.
