

Grants Pass Chamber to Direct Drive

The Grants Pass chamber of commerce was officially designated to sponsor Josephine County's participation in the 1939 San Francisco Golden Gate exposition Monday when a representative group of business and professional men from over the county assembled for the chamber of commerce forum luncheon and voted unanimously in favor of the proposition.

A sum of \$4874.40 is asked by the Redwood Empire association for erection of an exhibit, maintenance and advertising and services of an information girl in the Josephine county booth. The Oregon Caves Resort, realizing the value of Josephine county's participation, has offered a contribution of 10 per cent of the total, or \$478.44. John Litser, owner of the House of Mystery on Sardine Creek, pledged \$100, making a total of \$587.44 pledged to date.

A committee will be appointed in the near future by President

Theo. P. Cramer to consider ways and means to raising the remainder of the fund.

Considerable discussion preceded the vote being taken on whether or not Josephine county should spend almost \$5,000 to join the other eight counties of the Redwood Empire in showing at the San Francisco fair. It was brought out that an estimated number of five million people is expected to see the fair and a fair percentage will be encouraged to travel through the Redwood Empire before returning to their homes or en route to the exposition. Average expenditure of every tourist visiting Oregon last year was \$3.61 per day, an average of three persons per car remaining within the state an average of 9 1-2 days, according to figures read by the president from Harold B. Say. Over 18 million dollars was spent in Oregon last year by tourists.

"Josephine county should be willing to pay almost \$5,000 to join the Redwood Empire exhibit when our neighbor city, Medford, offered the Grants Pass Gladiolas society \$1,200 to hold their show in that city," C. A. Winetroust declared.

Ed Hughes offered support of farming organizations of the county and M. C. Athey announced Illinois Valley would back the rest of the county 100 per cent.

County Commissioner H. S. Morgan reported on a meeting of Redwood Empire association directors in Napa, California, last week, declaring the Empire would make an effort to direct traffic from Crescent City up the Redwood highway through Josephine county during the exposition year. Eureka was selected as the Empire convention city. Grants Pass Courier.

dent of the county who has to pay taxes and whose future is dependent upon basic natural resources. A sound tax structure and practical development of roads, schools and other public services of county government is directly dependent upon maintaining a stable and growing population, and fullest utilization of all basic resources not only to produce added revenues but distribute more equitably tax burdens of local government.

To effectuate a local unified program that takes into account the closely interrelated aspects of comprehensive development of the county, and to serve as a point of contact with other federal, state and local agencies, an informal development agency made up of representatives from all parts of the county was suggested by Charles E. Stricklin state engineer, and formally recommended by the County Economic conference held in January. Steps have been taken by O. K. Beals county agricultural agent, to have representatives of each area appointed to temporarily serve on such committee.

A complete report on the Josephine county studies made through the former Resettlement Administration now designated the Farm Security Administration, will be available to the public in the near future. Future land utilization studies, within limitation of funds and personnel, will be continued under Title III of the Bankhead-Jones Farm Tenant Act providing for transfer by secretary Wallace of these activities to the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, United States Department of Agriculture. Credit for these articles is given the Farm Security Administration inasmuch as most of the work was done by that agency.

to any number of miners during the season. Work that incidentally shows up the mineral or lack of mineral, as the case may be. Further, a man will not put out money on a claim unless he feels that he is justified if he gambles no money or time he will take a chance on ground that perhaps is of no value.

So we feel that the sooner the government returns to the assessment system, the sooner we will begin to get some place with our mining. At least it will give some of the boys on the creeks a chance for some ready cash. We also feel

that there is not a miner who works at his game but what will be glad to see the return of the old ruling.
