CHANCE FOR GOAT CHEESE MAKING

H. D. Manning, chairman of the directors of the Josephine County Dairy Goat association was in Cave Junction today in the interest of all goat owners.

The Zottola Brothers Cheese factory at Grants Pass has made connections for the sale of goat cheese in San Francisco, and in order to make the sale he must first send in a test cheese to see if it comes up to specifications. To make this test, Mr. Zottola must have at least 200 gallons of goat milk, and Mr. Manning wants all goat raisers in the valley to donate all the goat milk they can on August 20th before noon.

Mr. Zottola guarantees, according to Mr. Manning, that he will be able to quote prices on quantities of goats milk after this test run. There is a market for this variety of cheese and we have every facility for raising goats, and if we can secure goat cheese through this medium it will be a big boon to goat raisers in the valley.

The cheese factory will make this test willingly for the benefit of the goat owners in the county, but he cannot come out and get the milk, it must be delivered to him on the above mentioned day, August 20, before 12 o'clock.

If there are any goat raisers in the valley who will cooperate in this matter, please send a postal card to H. D. Manning, Grants Pass stating that you will do so and about how much milk you can deliver.
