Red Cross Campaign Now Open

R. K. Hackett, chairman of the Red Cross Roll Call, announced the appointment of an important committee. Sam Baker will take charge of special gifts to obtain the larger memberships in excess of one dollar. This will furnish most of the revenue for the local chapter's program as only fifty cents of each membership regardless of its size, is sent to the national organization.

Roll Call headquarters for the county has been set up in room 12 of the Lundberg building. Quota for this county is 12500 members and \$2,200.00.

The American Red Cross has been responsible for training thousands of people in administering First Aid to the injured. The purpose of First Aid is to give proper, immediate care to the injured, pending medical attention. Highway First Aid stations have been established and are distributed throughout the county where there is little chance for immediate medical care and have, in the past, rendered community service which few individuals or organizations are able to offer.

Expert First Aid training is offered to anyone interested in giving community service, and statistics have proven that those who are able to give practical application of First Aid are more careful for an accident prevention standpoint than those who are not trained; so the American Red Cross encourages everyone to take the course not only to help others but to make individuals see an accident in terms of possible pain to themselves.

The County Red Cross chapter has supervised the training of over 1200 persons in Josephine county and has placed equipment in Cave Junction with Nell Hayden.

"As County Health Officer, I try to keep in close touch with the programs and policies of volunteer agencies which pertain to the health of the people. As the Annual Roll Call of the American Red Cross is at hand, I would like to have the public informed concerning some of the activities of the Josephine County chapter," said Dr. S. B. Osgood, county health officer.

"For six years the county chapter has sponsored a Red Cross Nursing service here. A fine piece of work was done, and the foundation laid for the establishment of a full time public health department. When the Josephine County Health department was established on an official basis in 1937, it was no longer necessary for the Red Cross to maintain a nursing service here, but, in accordance with national policy, its resources were turned to other phases of public health and social service which existing organizations could not provide or perfect.

"In cooperation with the Josephine County Health department the local Red Cross chapter has furnished organization and materials for instruction in First Aid and Home Hygiene and care of the sick, has made available equipment such as beds, blankets, bedpans, hot water bottles, crutches, etc., for emergency use in care of the sick, has furnished food, shelter, hospitalization and drugs for emergency cases which official organizations were unable to

provide because of legal restrictions, etc.

"We, as a health department, believe that the Red Cross, here as elsewhere, is rendering valuable service and that it deserves your support."

Dr. Robert Russ, federal veterinarian, has requested that certain suggestions be made to those who will have beef cattle to test for Bang's disease.

He will arrange to test for you whenever you bring your cattle in

providing a request for the testing be made a week or so in advance. This request may be made thru the County Agent's office. The government will continue to pay indemnities until May 1, 1939. After that time unless the state cooperates with the government in payments, the indemnities will cease. It is important that all cattle in Josephine county be tested and reactors be removed before that date.
