COOPERATIVE DAIRY PROJECT IS APPROVED

A cooperative project between the federal and state departments of agriculture and the state college for dairy products quality improvement work in Oregon was approved in Washington, D. C., with A. W. Metzger, chief of the state department of agriculture foods and dairies division named project leader. Reports will be centered in Metzger's office in the state department of agriculture building in Salem.

With signing of this contract, this state becomes the first in the country to enter into a dairy products quality improvement setup with the federal government.

Another bit of good news in the Oregon dairy picture comes in the statement made to Mr. Metzger late last week by Roy C. Potts, marketing specialist from Washington, D. C., in charge of dairy and poultry products. Potts declared that Oregon butter has shown greater improvement in the last two years than in any previous 10 years, and commended the state department of agriculture for its "valuable and outstanding field work carried directly to the farm." Potts also praised the fine work of Dr. G. H. Wilster of the state college is doing in improving manufacturing methods in Oregon creameries.
