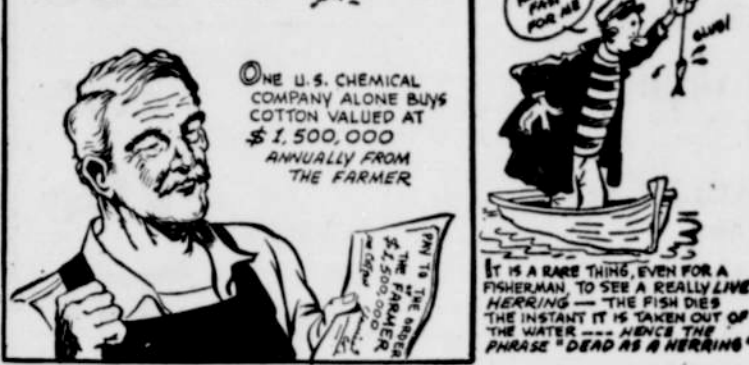

cations for the manufacture of these devices were adopted and all manufacturers were required to submit stock models of their devices for tests. This move spread throughout the country and our specifications with some additions have been adopted for the nation by the U. S. Bureau of Standards, the Underwriters' Laboratories, Inc., and by a number of states through action of their legislature.

The Oregon law prohibits the sale of unapproved electrical devices and provides severe penalties for violators, but no punishment by a court can equal the remorse that must be felt by the young man who constructed the device that caused the death of this innocent child.

All devices that have been approved for sale and use in Oregon bear a label stating that they have been approved by the commissioner of labor and can be purchased through any dealer in electrical merchandise for a small sum.

We again wish to issue the following warning to all prospective users of electric fence equipment. Do not try to construct your own unit. You may be responsible for the death of a neighbor or a member of your own family. Drawings and instructions taken from magazines are not to be trusted. Purchase only those devices bearing the approval label of this department or the Underwriters' Laboratories, Inc. If you are offered a unit that is not so approved, report it at once to the Bureau of Labor, Salem, Oregon.

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however, many fishermen are on hand for the few that are commencing to move into cooler waters.

Fishing for cutthroat and eastern brook trout is reported good in the smaller streams. A five mile hike up the Illinois river trail from Agness brings one to the turbulent waters of Indigo creek; a favorite stream for summer fishing with the fly. The limit may be caught here with little effort.

For the real hiker who prefers to penetrate the rougher country one need only continue up the Illinois river trail an additional four miles to the mouth of Silver creek. Here a very clear, cold stream traverses a rough woody canyon. This drainage with many lateral canyons is a real challenge to the real fisherman.

To fish in this area, it will be necessary to camp over night and fish upstream in the early morning and evening. It is advisable to obtain a camp fire permit at the Agness Ranger station.

A week's trip may be taken in this Illinois country which presents the opportunity of fishing in a different stream each day.

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Cave Junction Leads State in Registration

Cave Junction non-resident car registrations led the state of Oregon during the month of July, according to the secretary of state's compilations, with a total of 4,995 out-of-state cars receiving stickers at this station.

Ashland was second for the month, with a total of 4,453; Brookings third with 2,814; Umatilla fourth with 1,373 and Grants Pass fifth with 1,250.

Ashland leads the state in totals for the period from January 1 to July 31, with a total of 16,510; with the following top offices in successive orders: Cave Junction, 10,420; Brookings, 5,959; Grants Pass, 3,969; and Umatilla 3,416.
