under the direction of Harold Bowerman, ranger of the Redwood Ranger station.

Siskiyou forest has suffered 25 fires to date this season, stated L. L. Colvill, assistant forest supervisor, with 2100 acres burning. All but about 100 of the acres were burned in the Little Chetco fire of June 21.

"Much of our favorable fire record to date has been due in no small part to a reduction in the number of incendiary fires," Mr. Colvill said.
