**MERLE ELLIOTT  
FOUND DEAD IN  
TAKILMA HOME**

Merle Elliott, about 65 years old, was found dead in his home at Takilma by George Eggers at 2 o'clock this afternoon (Thursday).

The last seen of Mr. Elliott was Monday afternoon, and Takilma people believe he must have died Monday night some time.

Sheriff Don Barnes came out this afternoon on some matters pertaining to his office and met the Coroner, Virgil Hull and his Deputy, Walter Entliken, who had been notified and were on their way to Takilma and Sheriff Barnes accompanied them.

It is not known what caused his death, but Mr. Elliott had been

ailing for some time, and it is believed that he passed away in his sleep.

Dear Ed:

Yesterday, Sunday, I attended grave-side services of one of the best friends and neighbors I ever had thruout my long life. I did not grieve over the passing of this friend, for he had only obeyed what nature had decreed at the beginning of all life. Some great thinkers have said that there is no death and this I believe, in its literal meaning. Life cannot be destroyed, neither can intelligence or the form of earth that encompass them. There is only one life but many forms; there is only one intelligence.

Our Bible teaches us that God is love, light and happiness; it teaches us that God is life, knowledge and power; that He is omnipresent, omniscient and omnipotent, and that there is only one thing He cannot do: eff. The most beautiful thing that the Bible tells us is "That God is good," and that is all He requires of mankind. God never had to labor; all He had to do was say: Let there be and there was.

When God gave life to William Woodbury He gave of His own life which is indestructable. He gave him intelligence of His own—if it were not His He would not have given it—which is also indestructable, and the goodness God imparted to him grew and expanded with the passing years. The God-given love of "Bill" Woodbury overflowed his home, family and friends.

It was the year of 1909 that the Woodbury family came to the Illinois valley and settled on the old stage-road, near O'Brien. In those days there were but three or four near neighbors. What is meant by near is not more than a mile away. Woodbury home and the Webb were from four to five miles apart, yet there was always a strong bond of friendship between the two families. I believe it was my lot to know Bill more intimately and better than other of his neighbors. I have often been at his home, met him in many places, especially among our hills and forests. We can never know and judge a man properly unless we familiarize ourselves with his home life. The Woodbury home was always unpretentious, cosy, comfortable and happy. I have

often marveled at the great happiness so plainly obvious in that home. I do not believe this earth ever produced a couple more truly mated than Mr. and Mrs. Woodbury. It seems that their very lives were bound up in each other, a king and queen in their home.

Everything about Bill Woodbury was unpretentious, he cared nothing for popularity and his only creed was honesty. The greatest thing that can be said of anyone is that he is good. Bill Woodbury was truly Good. Such a citizen, husband, father, friend, deserves more than a passing notice. Requiescat in pace.

I have said that I did not grieve over Bill's passing, but I do grieve for her who will be compelled to live her remaining days without him.

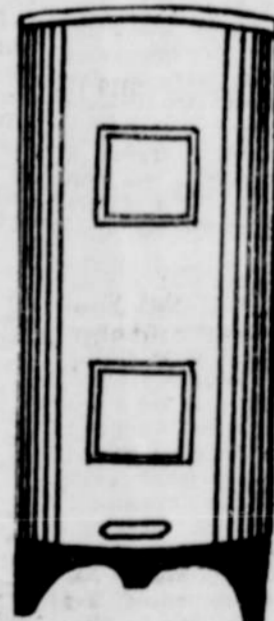
