Fighting Forest Fires Takes Tall Financing

Coincident with the adoption of a comprehensive forestry program by the Oregon legislature, comes the publication of the results of a study by Dr. W. H. Dreesen, agricultural economist at Oregon State college, entitled "Financing Fire Protection for Timber Lands under Oregon Laws." Some of Dr. Dreesen's findings, made prior to publication, are reflected in the new legislation.

This experiment bulletin, No. 384, shows that at total of \$470,249.93 was collected in 1938 for fire protection purposes in Oregon. This fund was collected from "tax roll" lands, from members of protective associations, and state, federal, and county contributions.

Former Oregon laws required that all owners of timber lands should

provide adequate protection against fire, while the recent bills just passed correct some of the weaknesses in the former laws, in the opinion of state and college forest officials.
