Marking his second starring action film, Tim Holt's new vehicle, "The Fargo Kid", presents a vivid picture of frontier days during the gold era in its tense adventure story.

The kid's assumption of the identity of a notorious bandit sets off the drama, much of which was photographed amid the breath-taking grandeur of the Escalante mountains in Utah near Zion National Park.

A young cowboy traveling to meet two friends in the mining town of Micaville, encounters a bandit in the desert. The Kid is forced to take the bandit's horse after the bandit has tried to hold him up. Because of the horse, the Kid is mistaken for the outlaw on arrival, and the town assayer, a thoroughgoing scoundrel, hires him to murder an elderly prospector on whose claim there is a secret vein of valuable ore.

Instead of carrying out the job the Kid tries to discover the assayer's motives, and enlists the aid of his two pals. But the real bandit arrives and the assayer learns the mistake he has made. As a result the complications arise to an intense pitch as the Kid seeks to save the prospector's life against the plottings of the assayer and his criminal allies.

Several thrilling fights and escapes feature the progress of the story to its climax, and with its scenic investiture, the picture makes an unusually interesting piece of film fare.

Egg Grading Meetings Point Way to Profits

Egg grading meetings are being held throughout the state this spring and early summer by the extension service at Oregon State college in cooperation with the state department of agriculture.

These meetings will afford opportunity for egg producers to discuss best methods of maintaining quality from hen to market, or other production problems with the

county agent and Noel Bennion, extension poultry specialist. At the same time, a representative of the state department will explain details of Oregon's egg grading law and show how farmers can get the most for their eggs once they are produced.

With the government committed to price support for eggs for the next year or more, proper handling and grading of eggs will pay good dividends and provide more of this defense food, it is pointed out.

Each county meeting is being called by the county agent who is in charge of local arrangements.
