

4-H Clubbers to Help Increase Meat Output

Oregon's 4-H club members will join 250,000 other 4-Hers throughout the nation in responding to the call for greater production of meat this year to supply home and national defense requirements, says H. C. Seymour, state club leader. Many club members are enrolling in the 1941 livestock projects, where they will produce all kinds of meat animals.

All those enrolled in such clubs are eligible to share in the benefits of the national 4-H meat animal competition. Last year the nation's four sectional winners, which included Robert Zielinski, Salem, reported gross returns on their enterprises totaling \$24,612 and cash prizes on exhibits totaling \$3247. The competition will start in the counties under the direction of county agents or county club agents.

Oregon Approves Wheat Quotas by 5555 to 260

Official returns from the 30 Oregon counties having growers eligible to vote in the wheat marketing quota referendum show that Oregon growers approved the quotas by a favorable vote of 95.5 per cent of the 5815 votes cast. The final total showed 5555 votes in favor of the quotas to 260 against. Approximately 83 per cent of the growers eligible to vote actually cast their ballots.

Lake was the only county failing to approve the quotas by the necessary two-thirds majority. The vote there was 47 yes and 31 no. Five counties reported a unanimous vote in favor of the plan, these being Columbia, Deschutes, Grant, Morrow, and Multnomah. In Crook and Josephine counties there was only one negative vote.

In announcing the results the state AAA office paid a tribute to the educational work in the various counties by the county and committeemen and the extension service, which resulted in such a heavy vote being recorded. Oregon gave one of the heaviest majorities in the nation in favor of the plan, which was carried nationally by more than 80 per cent favorable vote.

treated as personal property, and the county assessor or tax collector thereafter shall be entitled to pursue all of the rights and remedies provided by law for the collection of personal property taxes in the collection of taxes levied against such timber.

110-1003 — "Violation of act a misdemeanor: Fine: Enjoining the cutting or removing of timber. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the sections of this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a fine of not less than \$50 or (nor) more than \$1,000, and in addition to the criminal remedy herein provided for, the county in which said property is located may, through the district attorney of said county, maintain injunction proceedings against such person, firm or corporation from so cutting or removing any of said timber."

Realizing that in some instances timber owners may have cut timber inadvertently without having paid the taxes on the land please check up on your holdings and see that all taxes are paid on lands upon which timber has been cut or is now being cut.

For your information, starting with July 1, 1941, our cruiser will start a check on timber lands privately owned to ascertain whether or not taxes have been paid where timber has been cut or is now being cut.
