Cisco Kid Back in "Romance Of the Rio Grande"

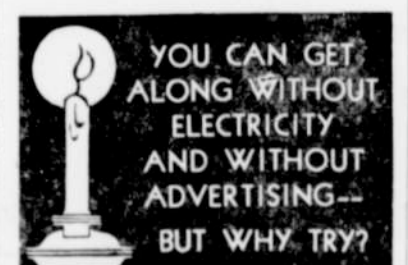
