Boys! No Firecrackers On Government Land

The annual reminder-warning to small boys and those not so small was issued from the Redwood Ranger Station here this week for prospective celebrants of July 4.

No firecrackers are allowed on any government forest premises. No exceptions exist to this rule, it was reported at the station.

CAMP FIRE PERMITS MUST BE SECURED

Campfire permits will be required on all national forest areas, except at campgrounds posted with signs specifically exempting the permits, beginning July 1.

Only places in the local Page Creek district where permits will not be required are Elk Valley

Forest camp, Grayback Forest camp and Store Gulch Forest camp. Permits may be obtained at Redwood Ranger station, Packers' camp, Elk Valley Guard Station, Store Gulch Guard Station, Cedar Guard Station and all of the 11 lookout stations in the district.

The permits will be good only for camping on government areas and will not license holders to camp on private land without permission by the owner. All persons wishing to get campfire permits for valley areas should get them from Dick Sowell, state fire warden, Cave Junction, Oregon.

The permits themselves carry a synopsis of federal fire laws and are justified on the basis that blazes during fire season can be controlled and identified through checking permit records. No permits will be required after September 30.

The four basic cautions for the campfire builder are the building of small fires away from brush and trees, the constant attending of the campfire, careful extinguishment and the giving of sanitary care to campfire refuse.

Stock Men Urged To Help Stamp Out Forest Disease

Reports of liver fluke infestation on areas used by range stock at the recent meeting of the Western Oregon Livestock association put the state-wide investigating machinery of the United States Department of Agriculture, Forest Service, the Fish and Wildlife Service and the State Game Commission into action to determine the disease areas.

Locally the Forest Service is engaged in a two-fold program to

stamp out any possible Illinois Valley manifestation of the "fluke" which especially lowers the resistance and attacks the bile ducts of sheep, goats and cattle. Distribution of information on the life cycle of the fluke and the conducting of a survey among those grazing stock on government land is included in the program.

Liver flukes are flat, brown, leaf-shaped worms that, as adults, live in the bile ducts of the above-mentioned "host" animals. Each fluke produces about 100,000 eggs which pass out of the animal in the manure. Those eggs that reach water develop into the second stage known technically as "miracidium." These minute "bugs" die within a few hours unless they find a snail with in which to become larvae.

A U.S.D.A. pamphlet describing proper treatment and preventive measures is available at Redwood Ranger station for those interested.

Reports of observation of any aspect of the liver fluke disease will be appreciated by the local ranger station. Statistics gained in the development of an eventual statewide control program.

the United States directing the second registration:

"Every male citizen of the United States, and every male alien residing in the continental United States or in the Territory of Hawaii, Puerto Rico or the Territory of Alaska (other than persons excepted by section 3 (a) of the Selective Training and Service Act of 1940 or by section 208 of the Coast Guard Auxiliary and Reserve Act of 1941) is required to and shall on July 1, 1941, present himself for and submit to registration before a duly designated registration official or selective service local board having jurisdiction in the area in which has his permanent home or in which he may happen to be on that day if—

"Such person on or before July 1, 1941, and subsequent to October 16, 1940, has attained the 21st anniversary of the day of his birth, and has not heretofore been registered under the Selective Training and Service Act of 1940."

3—Each resident of the State of Oregon subject to the Act and the proclamation made thereunder by the President of the United States shall register at the office

1—The second registration under the Selective Training and Service Act of 1940 shall take place on Tuesday, the first day of July, 1941, between the hours of 7 a. m. and 9 p. m.

2—The persons required to register are those listed below by the proclamation of the President of
