Dream Becomes Reality
As 160-Mile Road Opens

Completed after two years of actual construction work, the Harrisburg-Pittsburgh Tunnel turnpike is a 160-mile invitation to drive fast and safely under perfect conditions.

The Dream Road is a practical demonstration of how safety can be built into highways, leaving only the human element—the driver, himself—as a potential cause of accidents. Into this unsurpassed example of engineering and construction skill have gone all known methods of eliminating accidents—two-lane divided construction; wide shoulders to take parked cars off the roadway; grades and curves reduced to the absolute minimum; clover leaf interchanges to avoid traffic friction at points of entrance and exit; and nearly a thousand specially designed signs to tell motorists just how fast they can go and give them complete information about tunnels, curves and traffic interchanges they are approaching.

In planning the conditions under which the toll highway will be operated, the Turnpike commission has even taken steps to reduce accidents caused by the human element. The sale of intoxicants, for example, is prohibited at all of the service stations and restaurants along the route; pedestrians are barred. The latter step obviously will enable the Turnpike to produce accurate and enlightening information regarding accident frequency when only motor vehicles are using a public highway.

Position of Eyes Vary
In Different Animals

Eye arrangement shows a wide range of variation among the various animals. Human beings and apes have eyes which are set in the same plane so that the rays of light entering each eye are approximately parallel to each other. In such an arrangement the visual axes are said to be parallel, says the Better Vision Institute. In various animals the eyes are set in positions ranging up to a divergence of 170 degrees, or more than half a circle, between the two eyes.

The hare has eyes which are set at nearly right angles to its nose. Because of this it actually can see to some extent what is going on behind it. The rodent family, of which the hare is a member, have eye arrangements with divergences of visual axes from 50 degrees to 170 degrees between both eyes.

Nearest to man come the carnivorae, which include the cat and dog. The lion has a divergence of only 10 degrees in eye movement, and the cat has about 18 degrees. Eyes of dogs are set with 30 to 50 degrees of divergence between them. Pigs have divergence of 66 degrees; cows, 104; camels, 124, and giraffes, 144.

Eliminates Guessing in Cooking

Any article which helps you remove the guessing element from the cooking of meat is a blessing to seasoned cooks, as well as to those just setting out to win their spurs. Such an aid is the roast meter which tells you at what temperature to cook pork, lamb or beef to bring it to just the proper stage.

The meter is made of aluminum and is set on a skewer. Inserted in the aluminum skewer is a glass tube with a graduated scale to indicate the temperatures and on top is a scale which indicates the meaning of the readings. The bottom of the skewer comes off so that the glass tube can be removed and the whole meter thoroughly and easily cleaned.

One of these would make a thoughtful gift for a bride's shower, especially if you know that she is going to undertake serious cooking for the first time. More experienced cooks will find it a help, too, and career girls who have neither time nor money to waste on failures, and who want a reputation as fine cooks, will add it joyfully to their kitchen collection.

Use for Surplus Crops

Studies are being planned by the federal government for new outlets for surplus crops, it has been announced by Dr. Henry G. Knight of the department of agriculture. It is planned to put 200 scientists to work to discover more outlets for tobacco, dairy products, apples, vegetables, white potatoes, animal fats, hides, skins and leather. Expanding the uses of nicotine from tobacco will be one of the important researches. Nicotine is highly toxic to insect life and is useful both as a contact insecticide and stomach poison, Knight said. New uses for apple surplus, such as the development of an apple juice, new dried-apple products, pectin, cuticle wax, seed oil and residual pulp of apples, are being studied.

'Blackout' Glasses

Sun glasses that really do black out things are the newest of sun-protectors devised to aid the wearer guard his eyes effectively in any form of brightness. They are lenses of polaroid glass, set in spectacle-style shell frames and are immovable. A movable lens is behind each lens which can be turned to admit more or less light. At the present time they are expensive, the manufacturers say, but are invaluable in preventing eyestrain and headaches caused by extreme outdoor brightness in any season.

Deer Season
Same As
Last Year

Oregon's 1941 deer season will be at the same time this year as last, September 20 to October 25. The bag limit will be one mule deer or one blacktail deer, having not less than forked horns. This was decided by the Oregon State Game Commission at its June meeting.

A limited doe season was decided upon in two sections in order to cut down the overconcentration of deer. A total of 3,000 tags will be sold at \$2.00 each for does in all of Grant county and a small portion of Wheeler and part of Crook counties.

In the Fremont area located in Klamath and Lake counties 800 doe deer tags will be sold.

3,000 tags will be sold for antelope shooting from September 28 to October 5, both dates inclusive. Antelope territory is included in Lake, Malheur and Harney counties. In Southern Malheur county the antelope season has been set from September 22 through October 5 in order to conform with the Idaho season in this district, where a heavy concentration of antelope exists.

Applications for the special doe deer and antelope tags will be filled in the order received beginning on August 1. Any applications sent in prior to that time will be held and considered with those received on August 1.

In the northern Oregon elk season will be from November 1 to November 16. In this area each hunter will be entitled to one elk of either sex, and the \$5.00 tag provided under legislative enactment will be good for either a bull or cow elk.

In western Oregon bull elk may be taken in Coos and Douglas counties from noon on August 31 to September 7.

All China pheasant seasons will open this year on October 22. A three-day season has been provided following a two-year closure. The dates of this season are Wednesday, October 22, and Saturday and Sunday, October 25 and 26. The Willamette valley area includes the following counties: Yamhill, Washington, Multnomah, Columbia, Clackamas, Polk, Marion, Lane and Linn. The bag limit will be two birds a day or four birds for the three-day season. Shooting hours in the valley will be from 8 a.m. to sunset.

Tillamook, Curry, Lincoln and Clatsop counties will be closed to pheasant shooting because of scarcity of birds in these sections.

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TRAIL PAGEANT

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In all other counties, with the exception of the Willamette valley area and Malheur county, the season will be from October 22 through November 4, with a bag limit of four male birds a day and eight in any seven consecutive days or in possession at any one time.

In Malheur county, where natural reproduction is so great as to cause an abundance of birds, the season will extend from October 22 to November 23 and the possession bag limit of eight may include one female bird. The daily limit is four birds.

The valley quail will be from October 22 and through November 4, with a bag limit of ten birds in any seven days. Open counties include: Grant, Jefferson, Harney, Wheeler, Klamath, Lake, Umatilla, Gilliam, Wasco, Crook, Sherman, Morrow, Deschutes, Coos, Jackson, Josephine and Douglas.

The season for Hungarian partridges will be the same as pheasant season in all eastern Oregon counties, with a big limit of six birds a day.

Blue grouse may be shot only in Clatsop and Columbia counties with the season from October 22 to October 28 and a big limit of two birds a day or six in the season.
