ciate who within the last year announced progress in the search for a process of utilizing low-grade chromite, which is necessary for stainless steel and high quality armaments.

Chromite headed the representation, followed by manganese and cinnabar.

The minerals represented as occurring in Oregon ranged from those desperately needed for the defense effort to those in which there is no question of shortage, such as gold.
