Com. Clyde Of Portland Visits Valley

Hon. Ralph C. Clyde, city commissioner of Portland and Mrs. Clyde, expressed surprise today, (Thursday) on the development of Cave Junction, and while he had heard of the city he thought it was much smaller than it really was.

"This," he said, "looks more to me like a budding metropolitan center for a great community and I predict a brilliant future for the great Illinois valley. Having been in the newspaper business for a number of years, I can safely predict that the Illinois Valley News should be entitled to a great deal of praise for this development."

The commissioner went on further to say, "show me a dead town and I'll show you a town without a newspaper."

Replying to a question concerning the Rose City the commissioner replied, "On account of the ship building and other defense industries, the housing is becoming somewhat of a problem. So far we have not felt the shortage, but this does not mean that we will be able to meet the contingency in six months or so."

Mr. Clyde said that the water bureau of which he is the head, will sell \$500,000 worth of bonds to improve and extend the Portland water system which is owned by the city.

Among the domestic problems confronting the city council, of which he is also a member, is the raise in hauling garbage. The minimum charge of collecting garbage now is 50 cents a month, picked up once a week. They have asked for 75 cents, with proportionate raises for hotels and apartment houses. Mayor Riley appointed a fact finding committee of civic leaders to investigate and report their findings.

Another hot potato is the taxi cab fare in Portland. Some companies want a maximum of \$1 to any place in the city, others object. The emergency arose when one of the air lines purchased a couple of limousines and made the maximum fare 75 cents. Com. Clyde thought that the \$1 maximum would be adopted as shown by the preliminary vote last week.

Com. Clyde said that when one hot potato was disposed of at the city council another pops up, fiercest of these at the present time is the election of a city treasurer to succeed the late Wm. Adams, who held this position for 25 years. Numerous aspirants for this job and their friends have swarmed down on the commissioners and bring in all sorts of influence to bear for aspirants for the job.

Com. Clyde and Mrs. Clyde are taking an auto vacation and took some colored pictures of Crater Lake and the Oregon Caves and other interesting places en route, and he is very proud of his prize collection of colored stills, also some very interesting pictures he took while they were in Mexico.

CCC Companies Turned to Defense

For direct national defense work, 181 CCC camps have been assigned or promised to the army and navy, according to Lyle F. Watts, regional forester, Portland, Oregon. The work to which they are assigned usually is road or telephone construction, land clearing at army camps, building, recreation development, and similar services.

The North Pacific region has lost 19 forest camps during the past three months. They have been assigned directly to defense or discontinued to provide full enrollment for other camps. Enrollment is much slower than it has been because the boys are joining the army or getting jobs in defense industries, Watts said.

This reduction in the number of camps will leave many good projects unfinished. They will be missed especially in forest protection. Since the CCC was organized, in the North Pacific alone, it has among other things contributed about 700,000 man days to fire fighting and enough other suppression work to bring the total to more than a million man days. The CCC's have built about 6,300 miles of truck trail and a

similar mileage of telephone line, nearly 400 lookout towers and houses, 1000 miles of fire breaks, and 3 landing fields for airplanes. They contributed half a million man days to the control of forest insect pests and 115,000 man days to tree planting. They cruised a million and a half acres of timber, and built 150 miles of stock driveways. They improved 2500 acres for public camp grounds, built 1600 fireplaces, planted 3 1/2 million fish, and spent over 2500 man days looking for or assisting people who got lost or otherwise got into trouble, according to Watts.

With the Medford regional headquarters being abandoned, it is possible that the Illinois Valley may lose the Oregon Caves CCC company. The strength of the company is far below normal and replacements are next to impossible. If Oregon Caves company is retained, replacements will have to come from other companies disbanding.

FREIGHTER PLANE LANDS AT AIRPORT

Harry C. MacFarland of Eugene, brought down one of the largest planes ever to light on the I. V. airport, a Cunningham-Hall freighter, and is equipped to transport all kinds of material wherever it is needed and can be dropped with a parachute any place.

The plane has a pay load of 870 pounds and the crew and will take that load to 17,500 feet service ceiling. It has been especially adapted to change from a passenger craft to a freight craft in 15 or 20 minutes.

This ship was originally built by the Cunningham company to haul mining machinery to South America where the highest altitude is reached. Mr. MacFarland is especially interested in taking machinery to mines where roads are not available and hauling machinery would be prohibited otherwise.
