WINTER HALTS CHETCO DIVIDE TRAIL WORK

Trail crews stopped work on the Chetco Divide trail Monday and began moving their equipment into the Siskiyou National Forest Service warehouse on West I street in Grants Pass.

The trail, says the Daily Courier, which begins at the Wimer road on the east side and at the Brookings road on the west side, is being constructed to get mechanized transportation into the rugged Chetco country for fire protection. The interior has been accessible only by foot trails. The new trail under construction is a narrow gauge road that specially equipped trucks can run on.

During the summer six miles of road was constructed bringing the total since beginning of the project three years ago, to 24 miles. This leaves 10 miles of road yet to be constructed before the two sections meet.

Ranger Harold Bowerman was in charge of the construction from the Wimer road and Ranger E. H. Marshall headed the crew on the Brookings side.
