It seems that the budget committee and the Josephine county court have not duly considered all aspects of the appropriations for the first six months of 1942. For instance, the refusal to accept the salary increases for the various deputies in the courthouse. The argument was an attempt to reduce taxes, which proves that the matter was not carefully looked into, for the salary increases asked

for would have amounted to about six hundred and twenty-five dollars which would have raised taxes eleven thousandths of one mill, which means that a property owner paying taxes in the amount of one thousand dollars would have his taxes raised eleven cents. Also, the cost of living has raised enormously, much more in proportion than the increases asked for, so that in effect, the deputies would actually be getting less money than they were a year ago.

Again, the budget committee and county court have not thoroughly considered new equipment asked for in the various offices. For instance, recording and other work in the clerk's office has increased enormously in the past few years, so much so that the office force is unable to keep up with the work. The adding of a photostatic recording machine, costing about fifteen hundred dollars would enable the clerk's office to keep the work right up to date. There being no school in which the clerk's work might be learned, it having to be learned right in the office, it has been impossible so far to acquire suitable extra help. Such extra help as it has been and will be necessary to have, unless the machine is bought, will amount to about one thousand dollars a

year, so it can be seen at a glance that the machine would pay for itself in a year and a half, and that perfect work would result, and the present office force could take care of it without extra help. This explanation applies to the other offices according to their needs.

It seems strange that the road appropriation for only the first six months of 1942 should be more than for the whole year of 1941. Could it be that there being another election within the first six months of next year has anything to do with it?

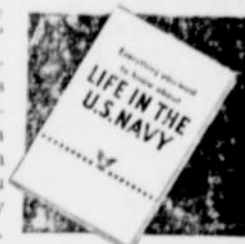
