History of Hospitalization In Josephine County

The history of hospitalization in Josephine County is marked by successive important achievements. The County Court, in various hospital managers, the medical profession, and the public have all played a part in these betterments and our Medical Society wishes to express its appreciation to all concerned. The people of Josephine County, for whom the hospital was built and is operated to serve, should have the right to express their opinion as to how and by whom their hospital is managed. However, those of us who have worked in and with the hospital for many years would be derelict in our duty if we did not offer our opinion as to the chief principles upon which operation of the hospital should be based. These are:

1. The hospital should be operated in such a manner as to make the care of the patient the first consideration. Standardization of hospitals under rules of and inspection by the American College of Surgeons best achieve this purpose.

2. Charges should be regulated so as to bring the facilities of this publicly owned institution within the reach of the underprivileged, as well as those in more comfortable circumstances. Whether the hospital operates at a profit or deficit should not be the determining factor.

3. The hospital should be a public service; and to achieve best results should operate similarly to our public schools, and the authority and responsibility should rest in a board serving without compensation, so that their only interest would be the best medical care obtainable for the patient, with due consideration for the public funds.

IN CONCLUSION

And now in closing we wish to say that the medical and surgical profession of the County have no quarrel with anyone licensed to practice healing. Many people get relaxation and are frequently benefited through the manipulation of the osteopath, chiropractor, naturopath and masseur. There is a good old homely saying "Let the shoemaker stick to his last" and this applies to the professions as well as the trades.

Medication and surgery are too serious to be indulged in by those who are not qualified to be accepted by the staff of the institution to which they seek admittance. Nearly all hospitals are the sole responsibility of a professional staff, but where the management is political, as it is here—the ethics of the medical and surgical profession will protect the public just as long as their standards prevail. Should these standards be lowered by those in authority, there will be no alternative for the staff except their disassociation from the Josephine General hospital.
