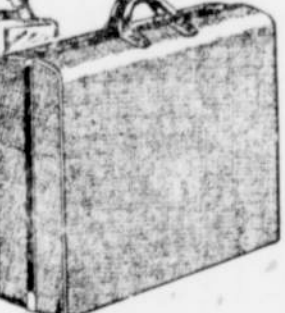

Change to H-B Developing Scratch Feed, feeding twice daily morning and evening in separate hoppers or in litter, giving what they will eat in 1 hour. H-B Chick Starter in hoppers all day except for 1/2 hour rest period before the evening feed. Clean water, No. 2 granite grit in hoppers. Chicks outdoors. Fresh, succulent greens daily, if not on green range.
