RAISE MORE FOOD

Last Tuesday an Associated Press dispatch from Washington, D. C., asks the farmers to raise more food. We quote the first paragraph:

Feed for chickens, turkeys, etc., is becoming so scarce that farmers who depend on the market for part of their feed in our section, are experiencing considerable difficulty in obtaining bare necessities to keep their flocks producing.

Just recently a truck driver who hauls feed and supplies for farmers to retail grocery stores so the farmer can buy feed, asked the office of Defense

After due consideration by the officials in Portland, the request was turned down as "not necessary." One government agency asks the farmers to raise more chickens and eggs. Another says it is not necessary to have a truck to haul feed so the farmers can raise more food.
