TRAVEL INCREASE TO MUIR WOODS DURING PAST YEAR TOLD

MILL VALLEY — Muir Woods national monument maintained its popularity during 1943 as an outstanding Redwood Empire scenic attraction, according to a survey just complete by the Redwood Empire association. December visitors to the giant redwoods increased 136 per cent over the same month of last year, while the fiscal year ending December 31, 1943 showed more than 57,448 persons visited the monument during the year, an increase of 11 per cent over the previous year. Members of the armed forces viewing the redwoods during December increased 231 per cent over last December, and for the fiscal year the increase was 21 per cent.
