The egg price support program puts major emphasis on the procurement of dried eggs, but a nation-wide carlot purchase program for shell eggs has also been announced. These activities are expected to be the chief means of supporting egg prices to farmers at the levels to which the War Food administration is committed.

The commitment previously announced was "not less than 30 cents per dozen in the spring and early summer and an annual average price of 34 cents per dozen, basis United States average farm price." The backbone of the shell egg purchase program is to be the

establishment of carlot prices for designated grades of eggs for 64 cities covering the United States.

Clarence Orin Wallace, Kerby father of eight children, has volunteered for active service in the army, passed his physical examination and is awaiting induction call.

Wallace, who will be 35 on February 8, is a "cat-skinner" for the Puget Timber Co., but said he did not "want to ride a deferment."

"I feel this is as much my war as any one else's and I feel if I am going to be in it, I want to be in the finish, at the finish. I don't want to be in a training camp over here nor sitting on a deferment."

"There are lots of cat-skinner who can't pass the examination that can do my work. The allotment my family will receive will equal what I make at the present time."

"I heard today a remark made by a public-spirited Kerby citizen that I sure don't think much of my family to go off and leave them like that, but I feel I have something that Uncle Sam can use. He must think so, too, for he accepted me in Portland January 27

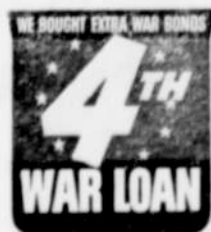
