FARM MACHINERY OUTLOOK IN 1944 SOMEWHAT BETTER

Oregon's 1944 farm machinery situation, while not so favorable as indicated by early reports, still is considerably improved over last year. N. C. Donaldson, executive assistant for the state AAA committee, reports.

The amount of new machinery allocated the state, while short of demand for most items, is from 20 to 80 per cent larger than last year for many items, Donaldson pointed out. More important, he believes, are indications that manufacturers have already made or will produce all of the machinery authorized, and that it will be delivered in time for seasonal use.

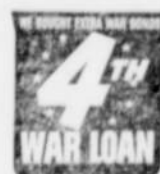
