

Hence, we should ultimately have in some form a currency which even if the circumstances were restricted would be interchangeable for gold. Thus, I predict that our present managed money system is on the way out.

More money has probably been lost through speculating in gold shares than in any other stocks. On a long-term basis, however, I now favor stocks of gold mining companies which were profitably producing before World War II. During the war, gold is subordinate in importance to nickel and copper and to the products of many other mines. In view of this, and the manpower shortage, nearly 60 per cent of the mines in the United States, Canada and South Africa have shut down. The remaining are operating on a greatly reduced basis; in fact gold production in United States and Canada is less than at anytime in 100 years.

After the war, when all efforts are turned to stimulating world trade, gold may prove the only medium through which international payments can be made. Thus gold may rise in value in terms of our present currency. Furthermore, as restrictions are lifted with respect to manpower and mater-
