Fourth Class Postmaster Examination

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced an examination to fill the position of fourth class postmaster at Kerby, Oregon. The examination will be held at Grants Pass, Ore. Receipt of applications will close on Mar. 31, 1944.

The salary for this position during the last fiscal year was \$886. The current salary will be temporarily increased by 15 per cent, the amount not to exceed an average of \$25 a month, by authority of an Act of Congress.

The date of examination will be stated on admission cards mailed to applicants after the close of receipt of applications, and will be about 15 days after that date. The examination is open to all citizens of the United States who reside within the territory supplied by the post office for which this examination is announced and who are at least 21 years of age, but not yet 65 on the date of the close of receipt of applications for this examination. "Sorry Judge, my shipment of suspenders still hasn't come in. Some articles are mighty scarce these days. I don't get anywhere near as much as I could sell."

"With the war going on, Frank, we've got to expect those things. It's true of luxuries just as it is of necessities. Take whiskey, for example. There's a real shortage in that. It's to be expected when you realize there hasn't been a drop of it distilled in this country since way back in October, 1942."

"The only thing distillers have been making during that time is war-alcohol for the Government. So, I wasn't surprised a bit to read how bootlegging and black markets have sprung up around the country as a result of the dwindling supply. Our 13 years of prohibition proved that if folks can't get legal whiskey, they'll get illicit whiskey. Sure hope the shortage doesn't last too long. I'd hate to see this country turned over to the bootleggers again."
