Old-Style Gasoline Coupons to Expire

Old-style gasoline ration coupons of the "B", "B31", "E" and "R" types will be invalid for use by the public after March 31, officials of the local office of the War Price and Rationing Board warned residents of the county.

Those coupons now in existence with expiration dates later than March 31 may be exchanged for the new coupons at local ration boards.

B BOOK HOLDERS HOPES SQUELCHED

Reports that "B" gasoline coupon holders will receive additional allowances are "entirely without foundation at this time," the Portland district OPA office has been advised by Leo F. Gentner, regional administrator of the office of price administration.

Gentner also declared that reports that expiration dates on "A" coupons would be removed were equally "inconsistent with fact."

Gentner's statement was issued after a long-distance telephone conversation with Col. Bryan Houston, OPA national ration chief in Washington, who declared the re-

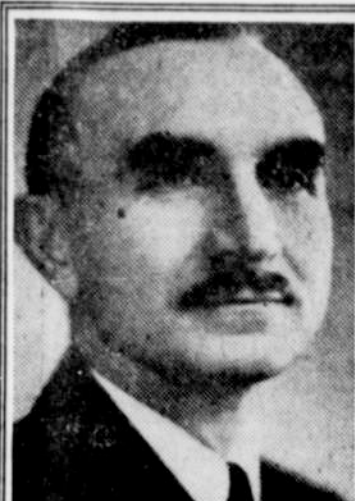
