to write administrative detail into any statute The best that could be done, therefore, in addition to throwing certain other safeguards around the administration of the law was to provide a system of appeal through the courts from OPA rulings.

It is true that some minor groups sought the passage of amendments that would give their interests special advantage. The House was to wreck the functioning of the law, but these attempts were also voted down by large majorities.
