fore small sawmills are scattered throughout Europe, especially so in Norway, Sweden and Finland.

Such things as limbs from trees, sawdust and so forth were and are put through a small portable conversion plant which makes wood sugar from the wood waste. This wood sugar is then carried to a large centralized conversion plant which makes ethyl alcohol and other valuable by-products. This was one of the reasons why the Nazis took Norway and Finland.

As we understand it these little portable conversion plants to make wood sugar at the saw mills costs about \$2000 in American money to install.

A Roumanian chemist by the name of Jan E. Bauer was one of the pioneers in Europe in working out formulas and building these wood waste plants. He came over to the United States and a corporation was organized, which, as we recall, was named the American Wood Waste Corporation. This corporation in turn was dissolved and the work was taken over by what is generally termed the "Timber Trust."

The original plan was to get all the small saw mills to put in these portable plants and then the wood sugar would be taken to the main

conversion plant. However the "Timber Trust" could see that if this by-product was put in the hands of small operators then the small operator would grow and prosper, whereas if the big operators or monopoly combine could have this process exclusively — then not only would it be making the profit on the by-product but also it would be able to sell its lumber on a price basis which would eventually succeed in driving the small independent saw mill out of business.

Today the saw mill operator who is small cannot get these portable wood waste conversion plants but instead we have the big operators who have not put in any capital of their own to amount to much but have secured a big appropriation from the government with the help of some of the so-called "people's" representatives in Congress — and then the "kept press" tells us what a wonderful thing has been done for we the people.

We are wondering if all these small sawmill operators are too careless to get together and fight to protect their own interests.

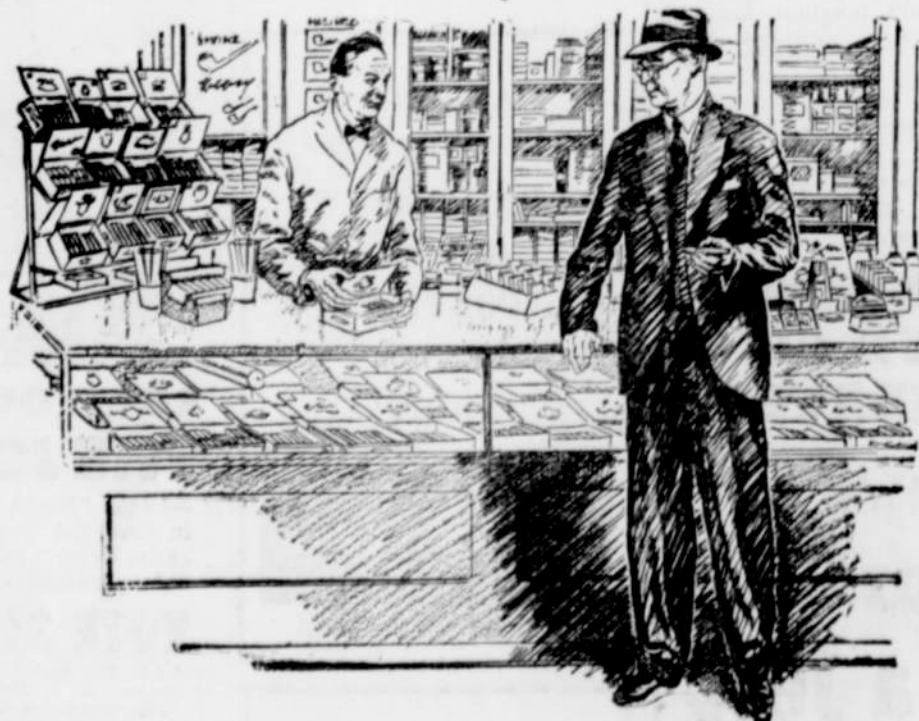
