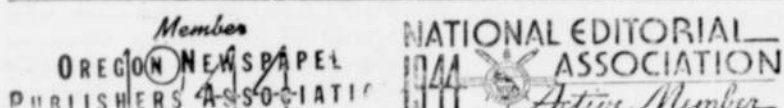

In all nations and localities there is a small minority who are disturbing and unlawful.

A wise and capable sheriff sees his first duty is to protect LIFE and property without fear or favor.

His second duty is to prevent crime and to do this he must thoroughly acquaint himself with the causes of crime, the nests where crime is bred and the best methods of handling such situations.

His fifth duty is the collection of taxes. The selection of an efficient staff who are directed by him to carry out their duties in a fair and equal consideration to all taxpayers.
