

Our War With Japan

The Sixth War Loan marks a new turn in the war both on the fighting and the home fronts. It points our tremendous war effort definitely in the direction of the Pacific.

Now our government asks us for a loan of 14 billion more dollars of which five billion dollars must come from individuals. Why? Haven't we nearly finished off our so-called Number 1 Enemy? Can Japan hold up our powerful war machine very long?

Here are some other Pacific realities so that you will understand why there must be a Sixth War Loan and why it is absolutely necessary that it be a success:

The Allied Military Command has estimated that it will take years, not months, to lick Japan.

Japan's present army numbers about 4,000,000 with 2,000,000 more men available and fit for military service who haven't been called up to date.

The Jap Air Force is growing.

In addition to millions of native workers, Japan has a potential slave force of 400,000,000 conquered people. 50% of Japan's labor force is made up of women.

The Jap, as our men in the Pacific know, will fight to the death. As far as the Jap is concerned, the outer Empire—and the men who defend it—are the expendables.

The Jap believes that we shall weary of war too easily and too early.

In the invasion of France, supply ships had an overnight run to make. In the coming Battle of Japan, ships in the Pacific will have long-reached round trips that often take five months to make.

These realities are worth thinking about before you keep your home front rendezvous with a Victory Volunteer. Perhaps you will feel that the national personal Sixth War Loan objective—purchase of at least one extra \$100 War Bond—is entirely too small for you.

AGRICULTURAL COMMITTEE APPOINTED

Organization of a county veteran's agricultural advisory committee for Josephine county was completed at a meeting held in Grants Pass, on November 10.

Plans are under way to provide every service possible to returning veterans interested in becoming established in agriculture in this county, according to H. G. Plummer, who was chosen chairman of the committee at the meeting.

While the committee itself is composed entirely of farmers, it will seek the cooperation of local committees of veterans' organizations, of farm organizations represented in this county, and of other agricultural service agencies prepared to render technical or other special services.

WAVES ENLISTMENTS TO BE CURTAILED

WAVES enlistments will be curtailed December 1 with only a limited number allocated to Oregon, according to Herb Crain, of the Medford U. S. Navy recruiting station.

Beginning in December, only enough WAVES will be enlisted nationally to provide replacements for the WAVES now on duty. The goal set for WAVES enlistments will be reached by December 1, due to the record of approximately 5,000 enlistments per month which has been maintained for the past year.

Although quotas now are being reduced young women of Oregon will have the opportunity to qualify for WAVES enlistments as in the past, except that applicants in the future will be placed on a waiting list and enlisted when openings are available.

Any young woman interested in the WAVES, it was emphasized, should complete her application and arrange to place her name on this waiting list so that she will receive first call when billets are open.

NEW CHURCH AT KERBY PROGRESSING

The new church building for the Assembly of God located at Kerby across the street from Johnson's grocery, is rapidly developing and the concrete foundation is about ready for the side walls, which will be stuccoed with the interior being plastered.

The new building will seat approximately 100 and it is 50x30 feet in size and a 30x24 parsonage joining onto the main building.

Rev. Wantland says that anyone who desires to contribute a day's labor or financial aid, it will be graciously accepted. Assembly of God is now holding services in the I. O. O. F. hall in Kerby.
