**SAYS POP CORN CAN BE PROFITABLE CROP**

Josephine county farmers have a possibility of increasing their income by raising pop corn as a cash crop, reports Jens F. Svinth, county agricultural agent. An amusement company is interested in this territory for pop corn production and is very desirous of starting such an industry in this county.

Pop corn, grown as a row crop necessitating a certain amount of cultivation, could fit in very well in a crop rotation system with ladino clover. Many of the clover fields are now getting too foul with weeds which are cutting down on the seed crop.

only then, said the amendment, could transmission lines be built by the government. The Senate defeated the amendment by a vote of 42 to 27.

The House is still debating the post-war highway bill. Many mem-

bers are dissatisfied with the large sums allocated to cities, but it is probably necessary to keep this part of the bill in order to get the remainder of it approved. Highway and market and access road work is a needed and worthwhile post-war undertaking.

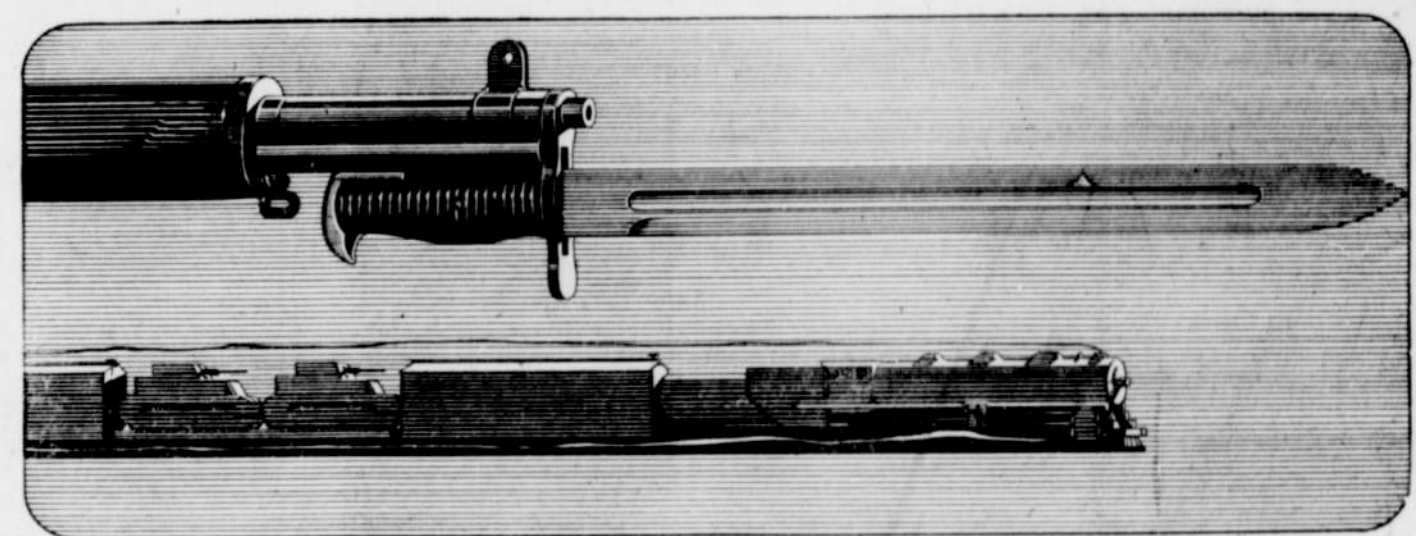
