"WE'VE NOT YET BEGUN TO FIGHT"

"We've not yet begun to fight!" declared John Paul Jones TODAY as he prepared to battle his way across the Pacific.

That famous phrase, first heard in the Revolutionary war, was repeated today by a direct descendant of the famed maritime hero. True to the family's sea-going tradition, the current John Paul Jones is an officer in the U. S. Merchant Marine, a veteran of the invasions of Salerno and Southern France.

Already the latter-day John Paul Jones has seen more warfare than the historical founder of his line. Because of the serious shortage of licensed Merchant Marine officers to man ships in the Pacific, the War Shipping Administration transferred John Paul Jones to the west coast. This will be his first voyage to the Pacific war zones.

Aboard a Merchant Marine Liberty ship in the Salerno, Italy invasion, Jones' ship went in with the first wave, anchored a half mile off shore and fought off German planes every single hour for seven days and nights. His ship brought down five planes — and John Paul Jones acted as gunner as well as ship's officer. Finally his ship was hit, the plates sprung, the propeller and shaft broken. By manning the pumps the crippled ship was gotten into a safe port.

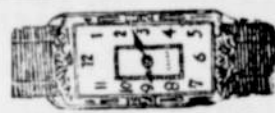
SPANISH TREASURY

Florida demonstrates the old maxim that good things are made slowly. Long before the Pilgrims landed in the North, Spanish and English explorers were battling to plant their colonies on the East Coast. Sebastian and John Cabot sailed along there in 1497 and in 1513 Ponce De Leon christened Florida. By 1647, St. Augustine had a population of 2,000. In 1585 Sir Francis Drake destroyed the town and looted its treasury. Spain rebuilt it the next year, much more substantially. Reconstruction must be done all over the world when the guns are silent. "I've seen merchant ships sunk all around us, by submarines and enemy planes, but so far my ships have only been wounded," declares Jones, who wears the uniform of a lieutenant j. g. in the U. S. Maritime service. "My last Liberty delivered troops to the Alpha beachhead for the opening invasion of Southern France — and we were the first Merchant Marine ship to enter the harbor of Marseilles. It was a shambles of sunken ships. When I went ashore in old clothes, the F. F. I. were rounding up German soldiers disguised in civilian clothes. When I carelessly replied 'Yah' to a question I was promptly arrested and freed only
