Josephine county's farm rationing committee, like those throughout the nation, was dismissed this week with the thanks of the state AAA committee and of War Food Administrator Marvin Jones for a difficult war job well done, according to Raymond Lathrop, chairman of the county AAA committee.

Complete cancellation of the farm machinery rationing program by removal of corn pickers—the only rationed item since September 29, has eliminated much of the work assigned to the committee. Remaining duties have been transferred to the county AAA committee.
