Fertilizer in Furrow Found Practical Idea

The practice of placing fertilizer at the bottom of the plow furrow when the soil is plowed for a crop is showing definite promise as a cheap and effective method of using commercial fertilizers, especially for deep-rooted crops, reports A. S. King, extension soils specialist at O. S. C. For such truck crops as tomatoes, potatoes, and cabbage, this method has given particularly good results as the commercial fertilizer is readily available even in dry weather at that depth. More shallow rooted crops such as peas have not shown as good response to fertilizers applied in the plow furrow.

Research work in this method has been carried on extensively in western Washington, King reports.
