The maturity date of the majority of Adjusted Service Certificates is January 1, 1945. Holders should contact their local service officer to obtain application and then file it at the post office.

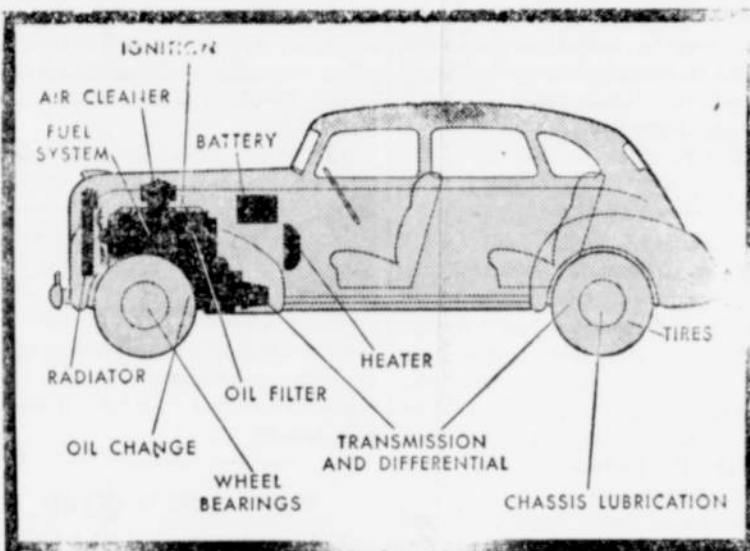
CLYDE EDMONDSON SENDS GREETINGS

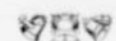
