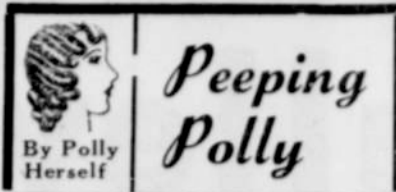
KERBY HIGH SCHOOL NEWS
