More Pedestrians Killed on Highways

Oregon's January traffic toll was the heaviest of any January since accurate traffic records have been maintained, Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell said today, in announcing 27 persons killed in motor vehicle accidents that month.

Of the 27 fatalities, 18 or 66 per cent were pedestrians. By far the greater percentage of the pedestrian fatalities involved elderly persons, struck during the hours of darkness, Farrell said.

In analyzing the pedestrian accidents, the safety division discovered that most of them occurred when the pedestrian stepped into the path of approaching vehicles.

"Many persons apparently do not realize that drivers may not be able to see them till they are within 40 or 50 feet of them on dark nights," Farrell said. "This is because we see only by reflected light, and dark clothing reflects only from five to seven per cent of the light that strikes it. Consequently, the pedestrian is not seen by the driver till he is too close to stop or swerve his vehicle to avoid an accident."

"The person on foot also does not always realize the speed at which an approaching car may be traveling. He sees the car a half block, or a block away, and assumes it is safe to proceed. But at 30 or 35 miles an hour, the car will go a block in less than 10 seconds."

"The short time it takes a car to travel a block and the fact that it is difficult for the driver to see pedestrians dressed in dark clothing, are the two principal reasons pedestrians should not start across the street in the path of an approaching car. Wait till it passes, then proceed."

SALE OF MINING PROPERTY MADE

Owen Jones of Grants Pass today announced purchase of the Kerby Queen copper property from George Clark of this city. The mining property is located west of Cave Junction, near Hanford gulch, about 43 miles from Grants Pass. No mention was made of the purchase price.

Production at the mine was about 3,000 tons between 1900 and 1905, Jones told the Courier. The ore was then taken from the upper levels of the property. A 700 foot tunnel topping the ore body has been run about 500 vertical feet below the old workings, he said.

Jones announced that work is to resume at once, and shipments to a Tacoma smelter will start as soon as loading facilities at Grants Pass are completed.
