National Forest Timber for Sale

Sealed bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Grants Pass, Oregon, up to and not later than 2:00 p.m., May 18, 1945, for all the live or dead timber marked or designated for cutting, located on an area embracing about 360 acres within Secs. 9, 15, and 16, T. 41 S. R. 8 W., W.M., Siskiyou National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 2,000,000 feet B.M., more or less of Douglas fir saw timber and an unestimated amount of Port Orford white cedar, sugar pine and incense cedar. No bid of less than \$3.00 per M feet for Douglas fir, \$10.00 per M feet for Port Orford white cedar, \$8.00 per M feet for sugar pine and \$1.00 per M feet for incense cedar will be considered. In determining the high bid the rate of Douglas fir only will be considered. In addition to the prices bid for stumpage, a co-operative deposit of \$.35 per M feet B. M., to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement will be required. \$2500.00 must accompany each bid, to be applied on the purchase price, refunded or retained in part as liquidated damages according to the conditions of sale. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Bids with rates in excess of those permissible under MPR No. 460 will be reduced to the allowable maximum in making the award. Before bids are submitted, full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Grants Pass, Oregon, or the District Ranger, Cave Junction, Oregon.

Intensive Fire Prevention Program Planned

Naming Charles E. Ogle, longtime Klamath county forest fire protection leader, as executive secretary of Keep Oregon Green, and warning Oregon residents they face the most critical forest fire season since the start of the war, KOG executive committeemen this week made plans for the most intensive fire prevention program in the five years of the organization. "With the demands of the military services requiring every able bodied man under draft age, the difficulty in securing adequate equipment and the threat of enemy incendiary devices challenging the fire fighting organizations of the west coast, it is more necessary than ever to reduce the man-caused fires to a minimum," said Edmund Hayes, of Keep Oregon Green.

Chairman Hayes, speaking for Governor Snell and the executive committee, said that an early start would be made this year in perfecting the state-wide Keep Oregon Green organization, and that county chairmen and workers would be named by Governor Snell shortly. Serving on the executive committee with Chairman Hayes are the following: N. S. Rogers, Salem, vice chairman; Paul M. Dunn, Corvallis; H. J. Cox and Arthur W. Prialux, Eugene; and W. H. Horning, John C. Kuhns, C. C. Scott, Paul M. Stevens, Stuart Moir, and Edward P. Stamm of Portland.

"We feel fortunate in being able to secure Mr. Ogle for our secretary," said Mr. Hayes. "He has had long experience in fire prevention and protection work, having served for years in Klamath county under Jack Kimball. Since 1935 he has been district warden of the Klamath Forest Protective Association, covering parts of Klamath, Lake and Jackson counties, and secretary-manager since the death of Mr. Kimball, getting his start with the same organization back in 1913. He was born at Klamath Agency, Oregon, in 1844."

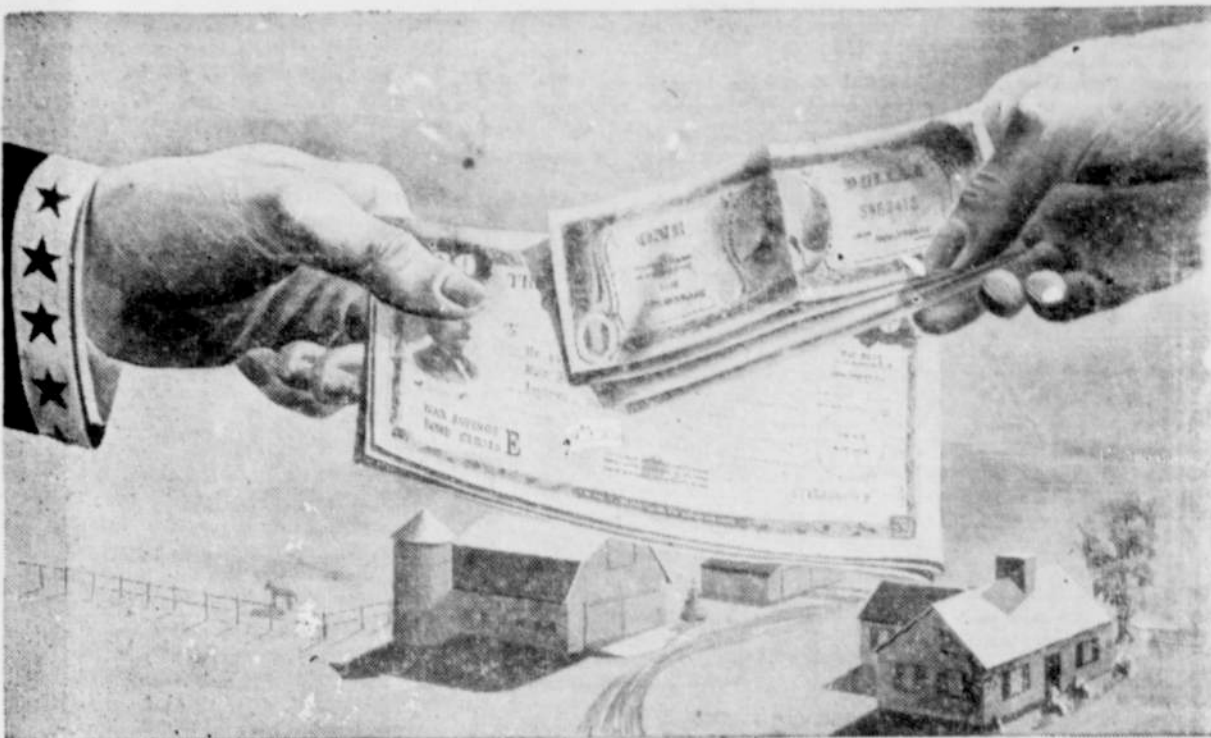
