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## W. C. Runyan Dies In Portland

Word was delayed until Saturday to Mrs. Clyde Runyan, that her husband had passed away in Portland, shortly after she had left that city to return to the ranch home on the west side road.

Mrs. Runyan remained with her husband, who was at the Veterans hospital, for nearly a week, after he showed improvement, but shortly after she left he suffered a heart attack which brought about his death. Communication is slow in the valley where there are no telephones, and the ranch being located on the west side road, it is presumed that she had the telegram mailed to her, which took another day before she was notified of his passing.

Mrs. Earl Boyd rushed Mrs. Runyan and her daughter-in-law, Mrs. Wadsworth, to Grants Pass last Saturday afternoon where they later took the train for Portland.

Mr. and Mrs. Runyan have lived in the valley for a number of years. Mrs. Runyan taught school last year in Selma, and has been engaged to teach the coming year in the Kerby grade school. Mr. Runyan has been in poor health for some time and was taken to the Josephine General hospital where he was for three weeks before going to the Veterans hospital in Portland.

## HIGHWAY NO. 62 OPENED TO TRAFFIC

MEDFORD, Ore. — State highway No. 62, crossing Crater Lake National Park between Union Creek and Fort Klamath, was opened for public travel on Tuesday, June 1. The National Park Service snow crews broke through the snow drifts on this road with a one-way road on June 10, and on the 11th broke turn-outs for cars to pass, so that the road was useable by Tuesday morning, if care is exercised in driving, and that

was the official opening date.

The snow crews started snow removal on the road from Annie Spring toward Park headquarters this week, but the snow drifts on this road are known to be very heavy, and no statement can be made at this time as to when the road to the rim of Crater Lake will be open. The superintendent estimates that this may not be for about two weeks.

## Ladino Seed Growers Should Apply for Certification Now

Ladino seed growers are urged to apply for field certification at the county agent's office between now and July 15th, Jens F. Svinth, county agricultural agent, said today.

Svinth stated that Ladino seed is still a vital war product to the extent that the Commodity Credit Corporation has again announced a support price of \$1.50 per pound on certified grades having a purity of 98 per cent or better.

Certification fees of 10c per acre with a minimum charge of \$1.00 will be payable at the time of filing applications.

Svinth pointed out that field certification was necessary in order to determine the presence or absence of the inferior white clover, as the plants are distinguishable but the seeds are not.
