School District Explained

The public schools of Josephine county compare favorably with other counties similarly situated. The administrators, teachers and school boards are to be commended for their splendid work in spite of handicaps in some districts. Our students who enter universities and colleges take their share of honors and rank alongside of students from elsewhere.

Because school buildings and instructional facilities are inadequate in many of our districts is no indictment. The citizens of every community are proud of their children and covet for them the best educational opportunities in this changing world. Few districts if any would hesitate to give their children the best schools possible.

Variation in taxable wealth among the several districts is the prime factor causing inequality in educational opportunities for not only children but adults as well. To overcome this obstacle is the first hurdle in providing adequate schools. The advocates of the County School District believe that equalization in county school funds among the several districts is a step in the right direction.

The last session of the Oregon legislature revised the law permitting counties to adopt the County School District. The acceptance or rejection is left entirely with the voters of the county.

The law provides that all second and third class school districts, including first class districts may unite to form the county district. In our case second and third class districts may vote to adopt the measures; these districts also must vote in favor of accepting Grants Pass school district, and the Grants Pass voters must vote in favor of becoming a part of the county district before the law becomes effective. If the majority of voters vote in favor of the County School District, the measure will become effective July 1, 1945.

Under this system the county schools will be administered by a County School Board of five members, one member to be elected from each of the five zones into which the county will be divided. Board members are elected by the voters of the county. Each zone must be represented by a board member who must serve without compensation.

The duties of the County School Board are practically the same as under the present district system. School districts will continue to have school boards but the title is changed to "local school committee". The function of these committees is not as broad as under our present manner of handling school matters.

The office of county school superintendent will be eliminated. Non-high school boards will be abolished, also joint high school districts. All other school boards will continue as "local school committees." The County School District, i. e., all schools in the county will be under the supervision of an

administrator who will be employed by the County School Board.

Under the unified county school tax levy pupils living in one sub-district may attend school in another subdistrict without paying tuition. Proponents of the measure believe that fewer pupils will be transported to the Grants Pass schools because all other attendance units in the county will have improved educational advantages.

The main arguments in favor of the County School District is in the belief that all districts will enjoy an enriched curriculum, better supervision, more adequate instructional equipment, better school buildings, and more nearly equality in education for boys and girls.

The 6 per cent limitation on tax levy for school purposes naturally prevents excessive spending. The County School Board and five lay citizens will constitute the county school budget committee.

The tax levy for school purposes will be spread evenly over the county. All assessed property will pay the same tax rate. Districts having low assessed valuation will have better schools maintained by the entire county. Grants Pass school district will contribute to the rural schools financially and educationally.

The County School District should make possible economy in quantity buying of supplies and equipment and at the same time eliminate duplication in administrative costs.

No doubt, the County School District will require greater school expenditures due to the fact that all the districts will have the advantage of improved methods, more modern equipment, and more adequate housing facilities. This is considered as a step in the direction of equalization of educational opportunities. The next step will come when equalization is extended to every school on a state-wide basis and the final solution is national equalization for the education of every boy and girl.

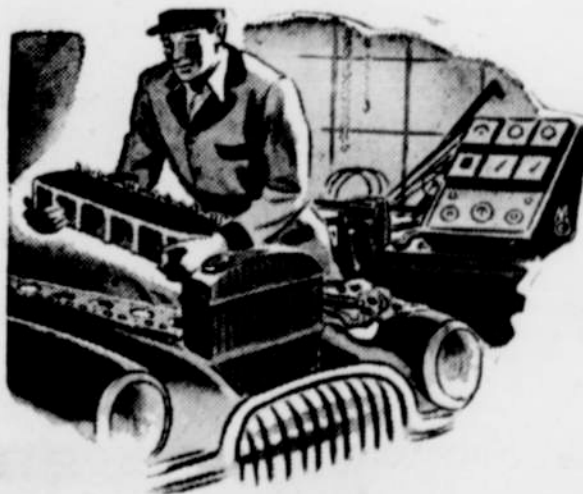
