WAVES NEEDED IN NEW SCHOOL

WAVES are being trained in rehabilitation work in the Navy hospital corps at a new school just opened in New York City. It is announced by the WAVES enlistment offices, 301 Exchange Bldg., Seattle, and 426 Park Bldg., Portland.

The 16-week course includes the principles and practices of occupational and physical therapy, teaching of the blind, deaf and orthopedically handicapped.

All courses in the new WAVE school are part of the regular curriculum of Hunter college, and trainees successfully completing their work will receive full college credit toward bachelor and master's degrees, the Navy said.

Experienced teachers in all fields of the handicapped have been assigned to the highly-specialized instruction which will be

supplemented by observation trips to schools institutions and hospitals in the New York City area.

The course is given in addition to the regular eight weeks' basic indoctrination which all WAVE enlistees receive and an additional two months' beginning training in the hospital corps. Enlistments in the WAVES are again unlimited due to the need for hospital corpsmen because of the heavy casualties at Okinawa and losses that must be anticipated in offensives against the Japanese home islands or the China coast. Age limits remain 20 to 36.
