ing, scheduled for the last Monday in July, employment of an executive director will be considered. A committee was named at the last session to select such an official. The salary, while not yet fixed, probably will be in the neighborhood of \$5000 a year.

Commission members said they are interested in the tax structures of other states and much of this information will be available within a month. This is being gathered by the state tax commission and other state agencies. The necessity for attracting industries to Oregon was stressed at the last commission meeting as a means of providing employment for the many men to be released from war jobs and returning service men. Nels Rogers state forester, reported that the timber interests of the state were outlining an extensive program in which the production of timber by-products would play an important part.

Information also will be obtained from the federal government as to the amount of money it expects to spend in Oregon as a postwar program. Special mention was made of the grazing program for which a large amount of money already has been appropriated.

At future meetings to be held in Salem, groups representing different political subdivisions will be called in to present demands. The commission was told that these political subdivisions are demanding more and more state funds. Representatives of Oregon counties and the League of Oregon Cities are expected to appear before the commission at its July meeting. Cities have repeatedly requested a larger share of liquor profits and state highway money. Education will have its inning at a later meeting.

Following two or three meetings in Salem the commission will move about the state so that its members may obtain a first hand picture of the industries and potential expansion possibilities.

The commission has an appropriation of \$20,000 and other funds may be sought from the state emergency board. The report of the commission will be filed with Governor Snell prior to the 1947 legislative session.
