

Youngsters Can Still Enter Navy

Enlistments in the Navy for those in the volunteer age groups are still open for men who wish to offer their services to their country, it was emphasized by Chief W. R. Cumley, recruiter-in-charge of the Navy Recruiting Station in Medford. This is in answer to numerous rumors that have been circulated relative to the closing of voluntary enlistments in the Naval Service.

The voluntary age groups comprise those who are 17 and have not reached their 18th birthday and those 38 to 50 and one half age bracket, Chief Cumley emphasized. Young men in the former age group are reminded that when coming to the Recruiting Station to make application they should bring their birth certificates, as the Navy accepts nothing less as proof of age. In addition, if a man is desirous of completing his enlistment on that day, he should bring his father or legal guardian who must sign consent forms in the presence of the recruiter. This will save time and trouble for all concerned, in the completion of the process of enlistment.

Notice of School Election Upon Question of Increasing Tax Levy Over Amount Limited by Section 11, Article XI, State Constitution.

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in Josephine County School District of Josephine County, State of Oregon, at the following school houses: Kerby Elementary, Takilma, Wilderville, Provolt, Missouri Flat, New Hope, Murphy, Williams, Mapleton, Fort Vannoy, Hugo, Oak Grove, Merlin, Jones Creek, Wolf Creek, North Fruitdale, Winona, Dimmick, Jerome Prairie, Pleasant Valley, O'Brien, Central, Sunny Valley, Galice, Dixie, Three Pines, South Fruitdale, Benton Mine in said school district August 16, 1945, 2 to 7 p. m., for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said district the question of increasing the tax levy for the year 1945-46 over the amount limited by section 11, article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon.

The reasons for increasing such levy are:
The Tax Commission and the Attorney General have ruled that the old districts did not have the authority to levy a tax for 1945-46 for the Josephine County School District.

Bonds previously voted by various school districts for desperately needed capital improvements cannot now be issued and by exceeding the 6% limitation the improvements can be made in one year without voting bonds and thereby avoiding bond interest.

The amount of tax, in excess of the 6% limitation, proposed to be levied for said year is \$185,835.52. Dated this 23rd day of July, 1945.

sary for the taxpayers to vote the budget again, and The News hopes the people will take enough interest in their schools to go to the school and vote the new budget. While the entire county budget will amount to something like \$375,273, it reduces the number of mills that the valley would have to pay under the old separate school districts, 35 mills as against nearly 60 mills.
