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County AAA Office Will Help Vets

The county AAA office is now prepared to give assistance to veterans who wish to obtain surplus war property for agricultural purposes, it is announced by Earl C. Reinhart, chairman of the County AAA committee.

Details of the new program just set up under the Federal Surplus Property Board have been received by the county committee together with application forms. Veterans have the right to buy up to \$2,500 worth of surplus property for use in business or agriculture. Applications for such property to be used in agriculture are made thru the AAA committee in the county in which the farm is located. After the AAA committee reviews and certifies applications they will be sent to the Portland office of the Smaller War Plants Corporation.

Any available item of surplus property may be purchased except real estate, aircraft, plants and facilities, and any type of property which is to be resold by the purchaser without processing. It is the function of the Smaller War Plants Corporation to attempt to locate any property for which the veteran applies.

Eligibility requirements for purchases include the following:

The total capital investment in the farm cannot exceed \$25,000, in which the veteran has at least a 50 per cent interest. All of the property to be purchased is useful to the operation of the farm and the success of the farming enterprise is reasonably probable.

The regulation defines a veteran as a person who has served in the military or naval service since September 16, 1940 and prior to the end of the war and who has an honorable discharge.

The price of the property to the veteran cannot exceed the cost to the government less appropriate allowances for depreciation, obsolescence, wear and tear, and similar factors relating to its condition and usefulness.

tives, J. C. Moore of the Oregon State Bureau of Markets and Chas. Cole, Mr. McKinnin and J. M. Knox of the Department of Agriculture of Oregon were then introduced.

The location for headquarters of the association was the first point of business. Members of the Oregon delegation, graciously submitted to California the right to name the city in California and also the privilege of incorporating under California laws. Consideration was then given to Eureka, as being the railhead and the center of a large acreage of the lily industry. After lengthy discussion Crescent City was selected as the headquarters for the association, as it was shown that growers from all of southern Oregon would be potential members of the association, and that Crescent City was the hub of the entire bulb growing area.

The name chosen was, West Coast Bulb Growers, and would be a non-stock organization organized under the laws of California.

Meetings are being held by the respective organizations at Eureka, Crescent City and Harbor, to discuss the plans of the organizations with all growers.

A general meeting will be called in the near future in Crescent City for the purpose of adopting the by-laws and electing a board of directors. At this meeting the aims and purposes of the organization will be explained and anyone wishing to join will be able to do so.
