NATIONAL FOREST TIMBER FOR SALE

Sealed bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Grants Pass, Oregon, up to and not later than 2:00 p.m., September 7, 1945, for all the live or dead timber marked or designated for cutting, located on an area embracing about 360 acres within Secs. 5 and 6, T. 41 S., R. 8 W., W. M. Siskiyou National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 2,000,000 feet B. M., more or less of Douglas-fir saw timber and an unestimated amount of Port Orford white-cedar, sugar pine and incense cedar. No bid of less than \$3.55 per M feet for Douglas-fir, \$11.00 per M feet for Port Orford white-cedar, \$9.50 per M feet for sugar pine and \$1.50 per M feet for incense cedar will be considered. In determining the high bid the rate of Douglas-fir only will be considered. In addition to the prices bid for stumpage, a cooperative deposit of \$35 per M feet B. M., to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement will be required. \$3,000.00 must accompany each bid, to be applied on the purchase price, refunded or retained in part as liquidated damages according to the conditions of sale. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Bids with rates in excess of those permissible under MPR No. 460 will be reduced to the allowable maximum in making the award. Before bids are submitted, full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Grants Pass, Oregon, or the District Ranger, Cave Junction, Oregon.

TELEGRAM

IMPORTANT. ATTENTION CALLED TO PROVISIONS NATIONAL CHARTER, NATIONAL CONSTITUTION AND EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE ACTION, NOVEMBER 1944, WHEREIN PERSONS REMAINING IN ARMED FORCES AFTER CESSATION OF HOSTILITIES AS FIXED BY U. S. GOVERNMENT IMMEDIATELY BECOME ELIGIBLE TO MEMBERSHIP IN AMERICAN LEGION PRIOR TO DISCHARGE OR SEPARATION FROM SERVICE . . . LEGIONNAIRE PARENTS MIGHT DESIRE TO SEND PAID-UP CARDS TO SONS AND DAUGHTERS IN SERVICE. FIRMS MAY WISH TO PROVIDE COMPLIMENTARY PAID MEMBERSHIPS FOR FORMER EMPLOYEES.
