Neglect of Battery, Tires Is Trouble for Motorists

To the motorist who is careless about the condition of his tires and battery at the start of the winter season, there is every chance of encountering trouble long before spring arrives.

This is the warning issued by Carl H. Brown, distributor for Mobil batteries and Federal tires in this area.

"The battery is asked to carry a much greater load in winter than in summer," Mr. Brown declares. "It takes heavy punishment when starting the motor on cold mornings; and in addition, with shorter days and longer nights, the greater need for lights increases the burden. With these conditions in mind, it is important to have the battery thoroughly checked before it fails completely and possibly at a critical moment."

REDWOOD EMPIRE CONVENTION NOV. 9

UKIAH, Oct. 3.—Advance reservations for the twenty-fifth annual meeting of the Redwood Empire Association here on November 9 assure the presence of large delegations from each of the nine Redwood Empire counties for a one-day work convention crowded with activity.

State officials, including the highway commissioners and engineers federal highway engineers of California and Oregon; directors and officials of the Golden Gate Bridge and Highway District; board of supervisors; representatives of chambers of commerce; city and county officials; Redwood Empire Association county directors and members of the association executive board will all be in attendance.

Nation Turns to Oregon for Forage Crops Seed

The nation is looking to Oregon more and more as a source of seed for better forage crops, says E. R. Jackman, extension specialist in farm crops at O. S. C. Right now people from nearly every state in the union are writing to obtain information on seed of the new non-shattering strain of tall oat grass, recently named Tualatin grass.

The old, tall oat grass has been the highest yielding grass at most state experiment stations, but seed is usually scarce because such a high percentage of it shatters on the ground before it can be harvested. This has caused seed growers to shy away from it, Jackman explains.

The Tualatin strain, originated at the Oregon experiment station, is practically shatter-proof. While Oregon seed growers are now going into production of Tualatin grass seed, there is a market for several times the present production.

Other seed crops in which out-of-state growers are showing increased interest are alta fescue, meadow foxtail and subterranean clover. Cumberland and midland clovers are also in demand, far exceeding the Oregon supply.
