RATIONING OUT ON SHOES AND CARS

Shoe rationing will end at mid-
night, OPA Administrator Chester
Bowles announced today.

Bowles said shoe production
had "taken a big jump since the
war ended and that the outlook
for a continuing increase is good."
"Approximately 28,000,000 pairs
will be made in October, as
against 20,029,000 pairs in Au-
gust," Bowles said. "Prospects are
that output for November and De-
cember will reach 2 to 30 million
pairs a month—equal to normal
consumer demand before the war."

In addition to shoes, the termi-
nation order also applies to leather-
soled house slippers.

Shoe rationing has been in ef-

fect since February 8, 1943.
New automobiles soon to go on
sale will not be rationed, the gov-
ernment announced yesterday.

The OPA and the War Produc-
tion Board, in a joint statement,
said that with nearly 24,000,000
cars now on the road, and new pro-
duction under way, "there is no
longer danger of a general break-
down of the automobile transpor-
tation system."

The agencies added that as new
production picks up, "newer and
better used cars will also become
increasingly available."

WATCH YOUR STEP— ACCIDENTS UPWARD

With motor vehicle use sloping
sharply upward during the month
of September, traffic fatalities in-
creased almost in exact proportion
to the increase in traffic volumes
for the month, Secretary of State
Robert S. Farrell said today.

There were 30 fatalities in Ore-
gon traffic last month, an increase
of 77 per cent over the fatality
toll of 17 for September of 1944.
Traffic volumes increased 76 per
cent in September of this year.

Motor vehicle registrations also
showed slight increases, as did
gasoline consumption. There were
416,076 motor vehicles registered
in the state at the end of Septem-
ber this year, compared to 413,039
a year ago. Gasoline consumption
for September showed an increase
of 34 per cent over consumption
of a year ago.

"The strong upward trend in
motor vehicle use in Oregon so far
is reflected in the traffic fatality
toll, but this is not inevitable,"
Farrell said. "While increased use
does mean increased exposure to
accident, this can be off-set by
the exercise of greater care on the
part of drivers and pedestrians. If
we avoid taking unnecessary risks
in traffic, consider all traffic con-
ditions and show respect for the
rights of others, we can hold the
fatality toll down despite the in-
creased exposure to accidents."
