PLANS TO BUILD FISH STOCKS TOLD

The Oregon Wildlife Federation continued its annual meeting today after hearing a discouraging report about anglers' prospects this summer.

Dr. Paul F. Needham, state game commission fisheries director, told delegates yesterday that it is doubtful Oregon will have enough game fish to meet the needs of an anticipated horde of tourist sportsmen.

He outlined plans to build up fish stocks: Four survey crews of four men each to study fish conditions throughout the state; fertilization of lakes increase in brood fish, taking of millions of eggs this season for propagation in Oregon's 13 hatcheries.

AAA Funds Allotted To Obtaining Technical Aid

Increased services to Oregon farmers in the form of technical assistance in planning and carrying out soil and water conservation practices will be offered under the 1946 agricultural conservation program, according to E. H. Miller, new chairman of the state AAA committee.

A provision of the 1946 program permits part of the state's allocation of funds for practice payments to be used for furnishing conservation services to farmers, Miller said. The state AAA committee has earmarked \$30,000 of the 1946 funds for that purpose.

This will make it possible, Miller explained, for county committees to furnish technical assistance to farmers in planning and carrying out such practices as reorganizing irrigation systems, drainage, contouring and terracing, and building dams for erosion control, stock water and irrigation.

The amount of such assistance available to farmers in any one county will depend on the amount budgeted by the county committee and the availability of qualified persons to employ. County allocations of funds for practice payments will be reduced by the amount

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counts used for technical service to farmers. Committees will be able to use such funds to employ technical aid when needed.

SPEED OF AUTOS STILL INCREASES

Prevailing speeds on Oregon highways continued to creep upward during the month of December, Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell Jr., reported today. During that month the ceiling speed of 85 percent of the drivers passing speed recorders maintained by the State Highway Department was 57 miles an hour.

In November, the ceiling for 85 percent of the drivers was 56 miles an hour. The ceilings for the twelve months of 1945 follow: January, 49; February, 50; March, 50; April, 50, May, 50; June, 49; July, 52; August (War's end), 55; September, 56; October, 56; November, 56; December, 57.

During December, only three percent of the drivers kept their speed below 35 miles an hour, Farrell said. Speed too great for traffic conditions is a prominent factor in most serious traffic accidents, the Secretary of State urged drivers to hold their speeds to a reasonable level, giving consideration for all traffic conditions at all times.
