Notice of School Election Upon Question of Increasing Tax Levy Over Amount Limited by Section 11, Article XI, State Constitution

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in the Josephine County School District of Josephine County, State of Oregon, at the following school houses: Central, Dimmick, Fort Vannoy, Galice, Hugo, Jerome Prairie, Kerby High School, Merlin, Murphy, New Hope, North Fruitdale, Oak Grove, O'Brien, Provolt, Sunny Valley, Wilderville, Williams, and Wolf Creek in said school district, for purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said district the question of increasing the tax levy for the year 1946-1947 over the amount limited by section 11, article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon.

The reasons for increasing such levy are: base too low for operation and maintenance of schools.
The amount of tax, in excess of the 6% limitation, proposed to be levied for said year is \$237,276.41.
